### **Just in time for the holidays: *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over***

*Devils Lake, ND* - Law enforcement across the state will have extra patrols to remove impaired drivers from the road from Dec. 18 until Jan. 31 as part of the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* campaign.

Preliminary 2020 data shows fatalities from alcohol are at 32%. However, alcohol and drug-related motor vehicle crashes, fatalities and arrests are 100% preventable. Drivers should always take personal responsibility by driving sober, designating a sober driver or using a ride-hailing service.

“If you choose to drink, make sure you designate a sober driver or use a ride-hailing service to get home,” says Devils Lake Police Chief Joe Knowski. “Give yourself and loved ones the gift of safer roads by driving sober over the holidays.”

This campaign is part of the Vision Zero strategy to eliminate motor vehicle crash fatalities and serious injuries on North Dakota roads.
