Just in time for the holidays: Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over

Fargo, ND - Law enforcement across the state will have extra patrols to remove impaired drivers from the road from Dec. 18 until Jan. 31 as part of the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* campaign.

Preliminary 2020 data shows fatalities from alcohol are at 32%. However, alcohol and drug-related motor vehicle crashes, fatalities and arrests are 100% preventable. Drivers should always take personal responsibility by driving sober, designating a sober driver or using a ride-hailing service.

"Save money this holiday season by avoiding fines for driving under the influence," says Traill County Sheriff Steve Hunt. "Designate a sober driver or make sure you've downloaded a ride-hailing app so you're sure to get home."

This campaign is part of the Vision Zero strategy to eliminate motor vehicle crash fatalities and serious injuries on North Dakota roads.
