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Crashes from impaired driving are preventable

WILLISTON, N.D. – Over the last five years, fatalities from alcohol-related crashes in North Dakota shows an overall decreasing trend, but each of these fatalities are 100% preventable by driving sober or finding a sober ride.

Law enforcement across the state will have extra patrols to remove impaired drivers from the road during *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* from Dec. 14 – Jan. 31, 2023.

"*Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over* focuses on making sure drivers know the importance of always driving sober or finding a sober ride," said McKenzie County Sheriff Matt Johansen. "One of the best ways to get home safely is to plan ahead. Know before you go out who the designated driver is."

This campaign is part of the [Vision Zero](#) strategy to eliminate motor vehicle crash fatalities and serious injuries on North Dakota roads.
